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**Engineering Updates/Activities**

- Staff is continuing preparation of the Water System Risk and Resilience Assessment and Plan. Certification of the Risk and Resilience Assessment is due by June 30, 2021.
- The Wastewater Treatment Plant Access Road Rehabilitation Project contract documents have been completed and, as allowed per CUPCCAA, requests for bids for the project were issued directly to four local contractors doing this type of work. Two bids were received and the selected contractor is Viborg Sand & Gravel in the amount of \$35,563.00. The contractor has been notified and is in the process of obtaining the necessary bonds and insurance to be provided along with the signed contract.
- Work is continuing on the evaluation of the relocation of the Nacimiento Water to the Creekside property. Conceptual level estimates and approach to overall project have been developed.
- Number of new will serve letter requests were steady with a mix of large commercial tenant improvements and residential improvements including a number of pools and ADUs.
- Ongoing review of several proposed projects within the District include review of utility plans, easements, and conditions to provide service. New projects tend to be more complex.

**Source Control**

- Outreach and Wastewater Permit activities are continuing with a focused effort to educate and enroll existing businesses into the wastewater permit program. Outreach meetings with District Industrial customers began in late April and will continue over the next few months.
- The Wastewater Sampling program is continuing with regular background testing and data collection. Additional data collection and discussions are underway.

**Meadowbrook WWTP**

- Consultant will prepare an evaluation of three main filtrations systems, including capital costs, ease of operation considerations, and ongoing maintenance and operations staffing and costs.
